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The Tlingit and Haida people, whose history is documented in these papers, ultimately are responsible for both the creation and preservation of these papers. They devoted time, dedication, money, and passion to the land claims movement, and lent their patronage to this project when there were, and are, many other pressing concerns. We hope that through this project and others like it, their struggles and achievements will be known and remembered.

PREFACE

In 1979 the Alaska Native Foundation initiated a survey of historic documents of organizations that had played a role in the Native claims movement. The survey described three collections relating to the Tlingit and Haida Indians of southeast Alaska: the administrative files of the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (CCTHITA); the Alaska Native Brotherhood materials gathered by William L. Paul, Sr.; and materials in the possession of I. S. Weissbrodt, claims attorney for the Tlingit and Haida. (See Native Organizations in Alaska: A Records Survey and Historical Profile by Barbara S. Smith).

The survey showed that while the three collections are each rich in informational value, the Weissbrodt papers were in greatest need of preservation measures. The William L. Paul, Sr. Papers had been microfilmed by the University of Washington Archives; the administrative files of CCTHITA are in a relatively secure environment. The Weissbrodt papers however, were in a Washington D.C. attic and subject to damage from heat and humidity, and risk of fire.

The CCTHITA, with limited funds available, sought additional funding to bring the Weissbrodt papers to Alaska and have them microfilmed, with the intention of making this large body of information about the Tlingit and Haida available to researchers. In 1981, the CCTHITA provided salary for project staff while an Alaska Historical Commission grant covered the majority of travel, supply, and microfilming costs. Sealaska Corporation donated use of a temperature and humidity-controlled room for long-term storage of the papers after microfilming. Their newly-formed nonprofit arm, Sealaska Heritage Foundation, donated office space and additional funding. I. S. Weissbrodt donated the papers themselves to Sealaska Heritage Foundation. Mr. Weissbrodt requested an inventory of the papers before they were transferred to Alaska and that inventory was the basis for this publication, which was developed to make the information in the collection readily accessible and useable to researchers.

The project was a first for CCTHITA in terms of preserving a large collection of historic documents. It sparked the long-standing interest of tribal members in their heritage, and also happily coincided with the formative first year of Sealaska Heritage Foundation, which is dedicated to cultural and historic preservation. Recognizing the need to provide access to this collection, and to preserve other historic materials generated or collected by the Tlingit, Haida and Tsimshian Indians, the Sealaska Heritage Foundation, CCTHITA, and Alaska Native Brotherhood and Sisterhood are exploring the possibility of establishing a tribal archives. The project to bring this collection to Alaska and have it microfilmed has thus been a factor in the promotion of, as well as a beneficiary of, interest in our heritage.

INTRODUCTION

The Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 is unprecedented in many respects in federal-Indian relations and has provoked a renewed interest in the history of the Alaska Native claims movement. Alaska Natives have been working for generations, however, towards equal rights and self-determination, as well as settlement of claims to aboriginal lands and resources. To better achieve their goals, the Tlingit and Haida Indians of southeast Alaska formed two enduring and cohesive organizations--the Alaska Native Brotherhood (ANB), founded in 1912, and the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (CCTHITA), established in 1935.

These two organizations have been a major force in reinforcing old customs and ideals and a forum for introducing and fostering new. Through the ANB and the CCTHITA, people forged strong alliances, acquired and developed skills, defined objectives and goals, altered their relations with non-Native agencies and individuals, and moved into the national political arena to lobby for settlement of claims.

The Curry-Weissbrodt Papers of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska were gathered and saved by attorneys working for the Tlingit and Haida from the 1940's to the 1970's. The collection includes materials relating to the administration of the CCTHITA, to lawsuits undertaken by the attorneys on behalf of the Tlingit and Haida, to the lobbying effort leading to the enactment of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971, and reference materials such as books, newspaper and magazine clippings, and government and other reports by or about Alaska Natives. The collection documents the high level of interest and participation in the claims movement by tribal members, the growing sophistication and changing activities of various individuals, and political, legal, and legislative tactics indicated or employed by the Tlingit and Haida Indians.

ORIGINS OF THE PAPERS

James E. Curry, former claims attorney for the Tlingit and Haida, collected and generated a variety of records and documents in the course of his work for the tribes in the 1940's and 1950's. He gave those materials to I. S. Weissbrodt when Weissbrodt and associates were engaged as claims attorneys for the tribes in 1957. The Weissbrodt firm also collected and generated a large volume of materials in connection with their work for the Tlingit and Haida. In 1981 I. S. Weissbrodt donated the Curry files, and the materials his firm had collected, to the Sealaska Heritage Foundation. The following section describes the organizations and individuals more fully. With minor changes it was taken from the historical profiles presented in Native Organizations in Alaska: A Records Survey and Historical Profile by Barbara S. Smith.

The Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (CCTHITA) is a direct offshoot of "the Alaska Native Brotherhood (ANB), the oldest of Alaska Native organizations. The CCTHITA was formed in response to an Act of Congress of June 19, 1935, which authorized it to bring suit in the U.S. Court of Claims for compensation for the prior loss of their aboriginal lands. The ANB, well-established in southeastern Alaska, included members from other tribes and non-Natives in their membership, which made it ineligible to press the land claims suit. The Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (THIA) variously known as the "Central Council," and the "Claims Committee," met annually, if not more frequently, and usually under the auspices of the ANB Annual Convention.

In 1947 the THIA engaged the services of James E. Curry and William L. Paul, Jr., as associate attorneys in the prosecution of the tribes' claims against the U.S. Curry and Paul also entered into contracts with a number of Alaska Native villages, communities, and associations, as general counsel.

In 1949 Curry associated I. S. Weissbrodt and David Cobb, and other attorneys to assist him under the 1947 contract. When this contract expired, the THIA entered into a new contract with I. S. Weissbrodt to continue the tribal claims lawsuit. I. S. Weissbrodt and associates, including Richmond Allan and Abraham Weissbrodt, served as claims attorney for the Tlingit and Haida to the present (1982), and as general counsel for them from 1968 to 1977. Also, the Weissbrodt firm served as Washington, D.C. counsel during the lobbying effort resulting in the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 (ANCSA). The Weissbrodt firm then served as Washington, D.C. counsel for Sealaska Corporation, the regional profit corporation formed under the terms of ANCSA, until 1977. (Records relating to Sealaska Corporation are not included in this collection).

The attorneys instituted a land claims suit, Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska vs. U.S. Docket 47900 in the Court of Claims in 1957. The attorneys presented proof of original ownership of lands in southeastern Alaska, the extent and boundaries of lands claimed; and claims for compensation for the lands and resources originally belonging to the Tlingit and Haida. The Court ruled the THIA did have original ownership of 17,500,000 acres of land and that the U.S. must make fair payment to them for the lands and resources that had been taken. In 1968 the Court awarded the Tlingit and Haida Indians \$7,546,053 as compensation for those lands.

The attorneys also presented claims to the Indian Claims Commission on behalf of the THIA. These were: a claims for damages arising out of the bombardment and burning of Angoon in 1882, which resulted in ~ settlement of \$90,000 to the village of Angoon (Docket 278-8); and two suits (Dockets 278 and 278-A) which were dismissed pursuant to ANCSA.

While the Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska were a de facto organization for many years and actively discussed and directed the lawsuits, they became more formally organized in the 1960s. In 1965 Congress amended the Act of June 1935, in order to clarify the status of the organization, which was known first as the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida, then as the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (CCTHITA). A Constitution and Rules of Election were submitted to Congress and incorporated into the legislation in 1965. The Constitution and Rules of Election provide for the election of delegates by Community Councils whose membership consists of enrolled Tlingit and Haida Indians residing within 100 miles. The Community Councils are allowed one delegate for each 100 enrolled members in their community. The delegates meet once a year to determine policy, appropriate funds, elect officers, and direct the general activities of the Central Council...The Officers of the organization, or the Executive Committee, consisting of a President and six Vice-Presidents, then direct the President and Executive Director in the administration of the Council staff.

In 1968, when the U.S. Court of Claims awarded \$7.5 million to the THIA, the funds were deposited in the U.S. Treasury until the Central Council developed a plan for their expenditure. The Court of Claims had left 2,628,000 acres of land out of the judgement decision, however, for which the Tlingits and Haidas could still press claims. The Central Council joined the statewide organization, the Alaska Federation of Natives, in lobbying Congress for a settlement. The Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 settled all land claims of the Tlingit and Haida Indians and CCTHITA turned to the implementation of their plans for the funds received in 1969.

The plan the CCTHITA developed was a "Six Point" plan calling for programs of assistance for the Tlingit and Haida people in

the areas of education and skills training, industrial and commercial training, services for the elderly, community development, housing assistance, and financing. Many of the programs and projects of CCTHITA are funded by federal and state contracts for services and have been administered by the Divisions of the Central Council. By contracting with federal and state agencies in these areas, the CCTHITA has been able to limit the expenditure of the judgement funds to the income from its investment. These funds are used to cover administrative costs. CCTHITA has also assisted in the formation of several corporations over which it now has appointive powers only.

In addition to administering the programs, the CCTHITA has continued to lobby Congress and the Alaska State Legislature on issues important to Alaska Natives and Native Americans.

ARRANGEMENT AND PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PAPERS

The Curry-Weissbrodt Papers of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska are arranged into three records groups: the Curry Papers, the Weissbrodt Papers, and Alaska Reference Materials. Each of these groups is described in more detail in the inventory, in addition to the overview given below.

The Curry Papers were created or generated by James E. Curry and associates from the 1930's to the 1950's and include materials relating to the Alaska Native Brotherhood, and issues of concern to the Tlingit and Haida, such as fishing rights and regulations, timber development, and possessory rights of Alaska Natives. The Curry Papers are arranged largely by subject in alphabetical order. There are 13 boxes of Curry Papers.

The Weissbrodt Papers were created and gathered by I. S. Weissbrodt and associates from 1957 to the 1970's. They are arranged into four sub-groups: two relating to the administration of the organization known as the Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska, or the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska; one relating to the claims lawsuits undertaken by I. S. Weissbrodt and associates; and the last relating to the lobbying effort that led to the enactment of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971. The Weissbrodt Papers are arranged in subject files, in chronological order on the box level. However there is considerable intermingling of materials from different time periods and from the Curry files. There are 37 boxes of Weissbrodt Papers.

The Alaska Reference Materials are primarily duplicates of materials in the Curry-Weissbrodt Papers, and reference materials gathered by Weissbrodt and associates. These materials are informally arranged by type or subject. The Alaska Reference Materials were not microfilmed. INVENTORY NUMBERING SYSTEM

The arrangement of the records and the inventory reflects the arrangement of the documents and records as they were found in storage boxes and files in the Weissbrodt offices. Each box contains materials found in one storage box, or grouped together as one series of records, in the Weissbrodt offices. Sometimes the contents of one storage box or a series of records were placed in two or more records storage boxes; this arrangement is indicated by boxes being numbered 1 and 1A, 2, 2A, 2B, for instance. Box numbers preceded by the letter C are from the Curry Papers.

The next level of arrangement, after boxes, is the file. Each file contains materials found in one file folder or one accordion file in the Weissbrodt offices. Many times these original file folders were crowded and the documents were placed into two or more file folders. An inventory number with a decimal point followed by a number shows that the contents of one original file folder were divided into a number of file folders.

For example, the inventory item numbered 13-2.3 refers to the contents of the thirteenth box in the Weissbrodt Papers. The file was second in the original storage box. The (.3) decimal three tells you the contents of that file folder were placed into a number of file folders and this item is the third of them.

In the Curry section of the inventory, the underlined headings indicate the original file folder label. In the Weissbrodt Papers section, the original file folder label is shown in quotation marks.

THE CURRY PAPERS - DESCRIPTION

The Curry Papers were created while James E. Curry and associates were active in the legal affairs of Alaska Natives, particularly of the Tlingit and Haida. While there are random documents from the 1930's, the bulk are from the late 1940's and early 1950's going up to 1957 when 1.5. Weissbrodt succeeded Curry as attorney for the Tlingit and Haida. William L. Paul, Jr., associate legal counsel with Curry during these years, is the principal correspondent.

Curry and Paul worked actively to promote recognition of possessory rights of Alaska Natives, and these papers reflect the wide range of their interests and services on behalf of their constituents. The Curry Papers include information and correspondence on such diverse subjects as fishing rights and regulations; timber development, possessory rights hearings and petitions for reservations, legislation on both the state and national levels, and lobbying efforts to obtain support from individuals, groups, national organizations, the Federal government, and the United Nations.

As several Native communities and organizations, including the Alaska Native Brotherhood and the Alaska Native Sisterhood, are represented in the Curry Papers, the Papers are especially valued for their depiction of the growing consciousness and activism of Alaska Natives in regard to their ancestral lands and resources. Organic documents, minutes of annual and other meetings, and correspondence of officers and members of Native organizations, are included.

The Curry Papers are arranged in subject categories, in alphabetical order. It is important to note, however, that the subject files are not all inclusive. While there are, for instance, files dedicated to the Alaska Native Brotherhood, materials relating to the ANB may also be found in individual correspondence files, or in geographical subject files.

Please note also that several files from the Curry Papers were moved to the Weissbrodt files for use by Weissbrodt and associates. Original file folder headings are underlined in the inventory.

BIOGRAPHY OF JAMES E. CURRY

The following short biography of James E. Curry was taken from the inventory

of the collection of his papers which have been donated to the National Anthropological Archives, Smithsonian Institution, Washington, D. C.

James E. Curry was born in Chicago, Illinois, June 30, 1907, of Irish-American parents. He entered Loyola University as a scholarship student and received his law degree there in 1930. After a short term of employment in the legal division of a large insurance company, he opened his own law office. At the same time, he was secretary of the Chicago branch of the American Civil Liberties Union and an attorney for the Consumers' Cooperatives. He married Alma M. Weihofen, also of Chicago, and in the winter of 1936 came to Washington to accept employment with the Indian Service. His term in the Service was short, but his duties required him to travel widely. He gained a first-hand knowledge of the problems of the Indian groups in many states. He also held government positions such as assistant chief legal advisor with the Consumers Counsel division of the Department of the Interior and counsel for the Reconstruction Administration in Puerto Rico. His Puerto Rican work consisted largely of representing public corporations that owned the various public utility systems there. After his return to the United States, his clients included the National Congress of American Indians and a large number of Indian tribes. His efforts on behalf of the Indian tribes resulted in a long-standing dispute with the government officials of the Interior Department and the eventual dwindling of his Indian business. From 1955 to the time of his death on August 23, 1972, he acted in an advisory and consultative capacity on the Indian claims cases he had carried for so many years.

THE WEISSBRODT PAPERS - DESCRIPTION

The Weissbrodt Papers of the Curry-Weissbrodt Papers were created or gathered by I.S. Weissbrodt and associates in their capacity as general counsel and claims attorney for the Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska. The majority of the Weissbrodt Papers relate to the tribal organization first termed the Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska (THIA), and later termed the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (CCTHITA) and to the claims lawsuits undertaken by I.S. Weissbrodt and associates on behalf of the Tlingit and Haida.

There are eleven boxes of THIA and CCTHITA administrative records. These files include attorney's reports, President's reports, contracts, minutes of meetings and resolutions, financial reports, speeches, testimony, correspondence and copies of correspondence, copies of materials of other organizations, and notes and drafts. The administrative files give good evidence of the activities and growth of the THIA/CCTHITA.

There are eighteen boxes of claims lawsuits records. The majority of them pertain to the lawsuit Docket 47900 in the U.S. Court of Claims. This record series includes exhibits and pleadings for the two main sections of that case, the first to prove original ownership and the extent and boundaries of lands claimed, the second to place a value on lands taken. (A partial list of plaintiff's and defendant's exhibits for that lawsuit is appended to the inventory.)

The Weissbrodt firm also presented three claims cases before the Indian Claims Commission on behalf of the THIA. The majority of these materials pertain to Docket 278-8, presenting claims for damages arising out of the bombardment of Angoon in 1882 by the U.S. Navy.

There are five boxes of records relating to the lobbying effort leading to the enactment of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 (ANCSA). These files include correspondence, Congressional bills,

testimony, copies of records of the Alaska Federation of Natives, attorneys' expense fee materials, and notes and drafts.

The Weissbrodt Papers are arranged into four subgroups: THIA Administrative Records, Claims Lawsuits Records, CCTHITA Administrative Records, and CCTHITA ANCSA Records. The Papers were arranged in chronological order at the box level only; file folders and documents are in the order in which they were found. Reference materials gathered by the Weissbrodt firm are in the Alaska Reference Materials Records Group. Also, please note that the Weissbrodt Papers include materials from the Curry files.

BIOGRAPHY OF I.S. WEISSBRODT

I.S. "Lefty" Weissbrodt was born in 1910 in New York City, the son of Austrian immigrants. He graduated from Columbia University Law School in 1935 and stayed at Columbia as a faculty assistant for two years, after graduation. In 1935, he entered into employment with the federal government. He served in a number of New Deal agencies, including: the Securities and Exchange Commission, the Office of Price Administration, the National Housing Agency, the Office of Housing Expediter, and briefly the Treasury Department. In 1947, he left government service and opened a law office in partnership with David Cobb. In 1949, he and Cobb were invited by James E. Curry to assist in the prosecution of claims of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska. Curry was claims attorney for a large number of Indian tribes, and beginning in the 1950's, he asked Cobb and Weissbrodt to undertake major responsibilities in those endeavors. While Weissbrodt's earliest Native American claims was with the Tlingit and Haida Indians, he later served as claims attorney for more than 30 tribes, and his work in connection with Native Americans composed the majority of his firm's work. In 1982, at the age of 72, Mr. Weissbrodt continues to work full time on Native American claims law suits and issues. (Records pertaining to his work for other tribes are located at his offices in Washington, D.C. Mr. Weissbrodt plans to donate those materials to the tribes themselves or to an archival facility in Washington. D.C.)
